2012 Southeast Colorado Art Guild Autumn Art Show

The Southeast Colorado Arts Guild (SECAG) in conjunction with The Southeast Colorado Arts Council is proud to present this Fall's Autumn Art Show at the Shore Art Center starting Tuesday, October 23rd. This art show is open to the public and will run for only four days. Here is the current schedule: Tuesday-Friday, October 23-26: 10:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. A wine and cheese reception will be held on Thursday, October 25 from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at the Shore Art Center. Awards will be given out at this time. Minors must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.

To encourage greater participation The Art Guild is offering cash awards for Best-of-Show, First Place in each category plus an Area Award for best depiction of a landmark within a 100-mile radius of Lamar, a Popular Choice Award, and a President's Choice Award. Certificates are awarded for second, third and honorable mention.

Only original works not previously entered in a SECAG Autumn Art Show are eligible for entry and showing. Works will be displayed and judged according to the following categories: Painting, Artisan Works, Drawing & Prints, Photography and Three-Dimensional.

Registration is Saturday, October 20 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the Shore Arts Center, 115 Main Street in Lamar. Registration is \$10 each or \$30 for three entries. One additional entry can be registered for \$5.

A student category is available for artists under college level, who wish to enter their work. The cost is reduced per entry for this category.

Project HOPE Chili Dinner – Open House a Hit

You take several dozen youngsters, fill them up on bowls of freshly made chili, grated cheese, crackers, apples and brownies and you have some energetic kids. Happy ones too. That was the scene for about 100 parents and students at the HOPE Center's Chili Supper and Silent Auction/ Open House at Lincoln School this past Thursday, October 11.

The Project HOPE Teen Center recently moved in to the former Lincoln Elementary School, painted, cleaned and moved around a lot of classroom furniture to make space for the daily run of around 120 students who use the Teen Center for homework, tutoring and learning some fun and useful talents, ranging from cooking, to music, to yo-yo expertise. Now that the RE-2 District has gone to a four-day school week this year, the Center offers a site where youngsters can get together with supervised activities through the day.

Lori Hammer, Project HOPE director, said the event was a fund-raiser in which all the proceeds from the chili dinner and silent auction will be used by the center. It was announced earlier that all profits would be doubled by the Legacy Bank. Most of the food was donated by Colorado Beef and local grocery stores. Volunteers cooked it all up at the district's central kitchen and started serving up bowls in the Lincoln School gymnasium as parents and kids took a look at the auction tables and made their bids with items ranging from a mountain bike, Canon camera and weed whacker, to smaller priced items such as caps, tee shirts and candles.
