Runnin' Lopes Booster Club Announces Adopt-An-Athlete

(Lamar, Colorado; October 16, 2012) The Lamar Community College Runnin' Lopes Booster Club announces the creation of an Adopt-an-Athlete program, effective immediately. This exciting development gives Booster Club and community members the opportunity to show support for LCC athletes and become more involved in Runnin' Lopes athletics.

The Adopt-an-Athlete program is set to be in full swing by November 1. The Booster Club will host a hamburger feed on October 30 at 6:00 p.m. in the LCC Wellness Center to bring host families and athletes together.

Families and individuals may adopt specific athletes or request that players be assigned to them. LCC student-athletes come to Lamar from all parts of the U.S. and the world. Many of them are away from home for the first time. Having a host family in the Lamar area makes their years in Lamar more welcoming and assists with a successful transition to college. Host families need not be booster club members to participate.

Similar programs have yielded lasting friendships between host families and athletes.

Simple guidelines have been created for the program.

- Adopt two or more athletes.
- Interact with assigned athletes one or two times each month (recommended). This can include inviting them to host homes or taking them out for dinner or other family activities.
- Show your support by attending their home games, matches or rodeos. Familiar, friendly faces in the stands increase their confidence and pride.
- Keep the Booster Club informed of your activities, so the program's success can be evaluated.

Students can be reassigned at the request of the athlete or host family if the perfect match has not been made.

BEWARE OF AMENDMENT 64

THE CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHT TO GROW, TRANSPORT, AND SELL MARIJUANA

Amendment 64 is much more than the legalization of the possession of one ounce of marijuana. A vote for Amendment 64 is a vote to allow marijuana stores with unlimited amounts of inventory to operate in your backyard, and a vote to allow organized crime and drug cartels to use Colorado residents to cultivate unlimited amounts of marijuana and distribute it from Colorado as opposed to Mexico.

The amendment claims that "tax revenues" will go to school capital improvement projects. Since possession of marijuana is still a federal crime, the possibility that federal authorities could seize any "tax revenues" as proceeds from an illegal crime and strip away any benefit the amendment may have is a reality, leaving Colorado to bear the financial burden of increased medical costs, driving under the influence fatalities, and increased rates of teen substance abuse.

Since Amendment 64 is a constitutional amendment, there will be little the legislature can do to fix the problems that the amendment will create. Making marijuana more available and more accessible will not reduce drug use and its adverse consequences for public health and safety. In the words of Governor Hickenlooper, "Colorado is known for many great things-marijuana should not be one of them".
