Law Enforcement - November 26, 2014

Shadron Stephens, age 42, was arrested for violation of a restraining order and held at the Prowers County Jail on \$750 bond.

Deputy Palacios-Deputies responded to the 33000 blk of Cnty Rd 7, on a report of a possible theft of services. Upon arrival RP said he had did some work on the other parties semi and the other party tried to leave without paying the bill.
